
## Maundy Thursday Worship, April 17, 7 pm Communion & Tenebrae

A series of scriptures, hymns, special music, the extinguishing of lights and communion will help us journey through the stories that tell of the end of Jesus' life. Childcare for infants - pre-school will be provided in the nursery.



#### Easter Sunday Worship, April 20

Come celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ at one of our two services at either 8:30 a.m. or 10:30 a.m. Both services will feature music by the Chancel Choir and all our hymns will be accompanied by a brass quartet. Hymns of the day include the triumphant processional *Christ the Lord Is Risen Today, Christ Arose*, and *That Easter Day with Joy Was Bright*. Rev. Brad Stagg will bring the message "Raised and Not Afraid" based upon the gospel reading Matthew 28:1-10. Children are encouraged to stay through worship as there will be no Children's Worship that morning, though nursery childcare will be made available.



#### Bit from Brad

This is the holiest of weeks in the Christian faith. From Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, the whole church of God gathers to pray, sing, reflect, and celebrate upon the passion and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. To receive the most from this time, I recommend several things.

First, come to our Holy Week Services. First, we have our 7pm Maundy Thursday Service which will remember our Lord's Last Supper as well as his crucifixion. The word "Maundy" comes from Latin meaning "mandate," since Jesus commanded his followers to remember him through the bread and cup. The second half of the service will focus on Jesus' final words on the cross and we depart in silence. The second service is our 8:30 & 10:30 Easter Sunday Services. With the brass combo, we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord; a joyous celebration!

Second, I highly recommend that you make time to read the last three chapters of Matthew; chapters 26, 27, 28. I just finished reading them with the Tuesday Bible Study group and hearing them again, brings us back to the power of passion and glory of the gospel in Jesus Christ. There is simply no substitute for slowly reading and mediating on this amazing passage. For bonus material, read Psalm 22 and consider how Jesus quoted Ps. 22:1 upon the cross, as he alluded to his death as the fulfillment of King David's prophecy.

And, third, pray! Pray each day; pray silently; pray with your family; pray aloud; pray in worship! Make time each day of Holy Week to pray to God, asking the Holy Spirit what it is that you need to hear this Holy Week. Ask: "God, what would you have me know or do for you this week?" And then, listen.

May this Holy Week be your deepest yet! Amen! ~Blessings, Brad

It was the social event of early spring as over 100 members and friends of First Christian gathered in Bethany Hall to share in a celebration of water. The celebration came in the






#### **Disciples Heritage Tour**

Alexander Campbell and Barton Stone, Disciples from West Virginia and Christians from Kentucky - 26 members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) from Missouri endeavored to find the story of our people and church heritage April 7-11, 2014.

The clergy and members from First Christian Church in Columbia joined forces with clergy and members of Community Christian Church in Manchester, MO for a five day-sixteen hundred mile tour of denominational heritage. The pictures on the reverse of this page show some highlights of the places and folks. In Kentucky: historic Central Christian Church, Lexington KY, The Cane Ridge Meeting House (Barton W. Stone's log church) in Bourbon County, Kentucky. In Bethany, West Virginia: Bethany College, The Old Meeting House, Historic Bethany-home of Alexander Campbell, and Memorial Christian Church. In Indiana: Disciples Center - the national offices of The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) where church leaders from across the spectrum of national ministry spoke to the group. We also found other churches along the way including First Christian Church in Wheeling, WV, Paris, KY, and Frankfort, KY.

The story of Christian unity, communion, believer's baptism, the freedom of Christian thought and discourse were so evident in the history uncovered. The group also found just joy in making the journey with new disciple friends from St. Louis (including Mary Rogers Gordon) and within the group from Columbia. It was a great trip!
