
Worship Sunday, July 5



A Bit from Brad

Board Actions: Tuesday, June 16, FCC's Admin. Board met and voted on numerous items. For a full accounting, please wait for the approved minutes of that meeting, but in the meantime here are the highlights of the Board Actions:

Two new departments were officially created: 1) Evangelism Department and 2) Advent Department. Approximately 8 years ago, Evangelism was a stand-alone department and for various reasons merged into the already very active Membership Department. As time went on, the Membership Department simply could not accommodate all of its programming as well as the responsibilities of Evangelism; as such Evangelism suffered tremendously. To remedy that situation, the Board created a department to handle this most vital ministry needed for FCC. I will be the staff leader for Evangelism. The Advent Department would be responsible for planning, recruiting, coordinating, and implementing all programmatic ministries particular to the Advent and Christmas seasons. Programs, included but not limited to, are: Hanging of the Greens, Weekly Advent Wreath & Candles, Living Nativity & Refreshments, Christmas Pageant & Tasting Party, Christmas Lights Driving Tour, Caroling, & Christmas Eve Services. Jimmy Spear will staff this department.

Bragg Stanley was authorized as a voting delegate to General Assembly in Columbus, OH. Our prayers go with you, Bragg!

The Property Department's two motions passed. 1) The first motion was to authorize Boone County to contract with Engineering Surveys & Services to complete plans for a parking lot where the current park is situated, not to exceed \$20,000. 2) The second motion was to contract with Missouri Builders Services, Inc. to furnish Chimney Caps for the Education Building as part of the building weatherization at the cost of \$1,818, funds coming from the Repair Account.

Stewardship & Finances' four motions passed. 1) The first motion was that the Katherine Yost Memorial Fund be used to cover the expenses of the Website. 2) Second, the Alex "Bud" Smith gift was officially renamed, the Alex "Bud" and Fern Smith Fund so as to honor Bud's wife, Fern, a loyal active member of FCC all her life. 3) The third motion approved for funding of the Tier One Capital Campaign over-and-above the pledges secured for the projects needed. Some funding came from memorial accounts, including the Bud & Fern Smith Fund. The Line of Credit was approved to be drawn from for expenditures over-and-above those pledges and funds. 4) The 2015-16 Budget was submitted and approved. More details are found in the insert of this edition of *The Visitor*.

Board Officers and Department Chairs were approved. Bragg Stanley & CK Hoenes return to their respective offices as Moderator and Vice-Moderator; Dan Gieseke will be the Treasurer for next year. ~Blessings, Brad

Congregational Meeting: Voting on the 2015-16 Operating Budget

This Sunday, June 28, the Congregation will vote on the annual Operating Budget, as required by FCC's Bylaws. A compressed budget is on the next page of this insert of *The Visitor*; the longer line-by-line detailed budget is available for those interested. One can be easily emailed to you if you contact the church office or you may find a printed copy on the bulletin board outside the church office. Limited number of line-by-line budgets will be available on Sunday morning.

Highlights of the Budget: The Good News is that between the Operating Budget and the Capital Campaign, FCC members and friends are giving more funds in total than ever before, which we celebrate and give thanks to God. The Bad News is that this year's Operating Budget is approximately 5% less than last year's budget. Knowing supporters of FCC are giving at record level, the Stewardship & Finance Dept., Cabinet, and the Board agree leadership should not ask for more additional funding.

As such, the Departments and Committees were asked to cut 5% of their requested budgets. This does not apply to CAOAM, the Preschool, World Outreach, or Church in Society. World Outreach and Church in Society continue to receive 4% and 2% of actual offerings and rental income. The largest cut was to the Administrative Committee/Human Relations Department; our staff will not be receiving raises as requested and our clergy will not have their educational or travel benefits, though they will have the freedom to find benefactors or patrons who would like to sponsor their educational opportunities.

Additions to the Budget include funds for a new Evangelism Department and increase to the Communications Department as they increase FCC's web presence. All of these are important as this year our staff will put significant effort into Evangelism.

Exploration Meeting: Who's Interested in Israel?

On Sunday, July 12 at 9:30 a.m., Rev. Brad Stagg and Rev. Dr. Cliff Cain, the C.S. Lewis Professor of Religious Studies and Department Chair at Westminster College, will lead an exploration meeting to see who might be interested in traveling to Israel in May, 2016. Even if you can't travel, come see Dr. Cain's PowerPoint slides of the Holy Land! As Rev. Stagg says, "The Holy Land truly is the Fifth Gospel!" All are welcome!


Chi-Rho Mission Trip
