Lent Begins - Soup, Ashes and Care of Soul

Please join us on Ash Wednesday, February 10th, for our simple "Soup for the Soul" dinner followed by the Ash Wednesday service. Dinner begins at 5:30 (RSVP via pew pad or call church office so we can have enough soup and bread) and the service follows at 6:30 pm.

This is truly one of our church's "best kept secrets"! My family and I have attended this service for many years and have found it to be a meaningful start to the Lenten season. Each year I wonder what to do with Lent? Some years I add something to my normal routine (usually

the daily devotional book provided by our church), some years I give something up (Chocolate? Coffee? Something of equal challenge for you?), and some years I do both! While neither are required, it's just something to think about as we remember Jesus' walk and suffering during this time.

Ash Wednesday marks the first day of the Lenten season (and it's not just for Catholics!). Lent is 46 days long including 40 days of "fasting" and 6 Sundays between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. According to Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus spent 40 days fasting in the desert while enduring temptations by Satan. Lent mirrors this time by fasting for 40 days as preparation for Easter. Hence our giving something up. Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of "blessing ashes" made from palm branches placed on the head or hand of participants.

Will you join your church family this Lent? I know I am starting with Wednesday's quaint and quiet service. All are welcome!



The Cinema is OPEN!


