Mother Angelica

As I have given up dish network/cable TV since the first of the year, and as I am always in a search for what is free over the airwaves, I came across an obscure religious station. There was the famous TV evangelist Jim Bakker, next to a very attractive blonde woman. With the white beard and a cap he was not easily recognizable — but I knew that face, voice, and talent for making a spectacle of Jesus on TV. I remember too well his ministry success and demise of decades ago.

I mention this because on the other end of the spectrum — and it is at this end that I think we find ourselves learning something about the power of God — there was Mother Angelica.

When flipping channels over the years I have always been intrigued by the TV ministry of a habit-wearing, friendly, older nun named Mother Angelica. I read recently that she died on Easter Sunday at the age of 92. The American Franciscan nun is best known as a television personality and the founder of both the internationally-broadcast cable television network Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) and the radio network WEWN. It was in 1981 that with \$200 start up money she began broadcasting a religious talk show from a TV studio put together in her Birmingham, Alabama monastery's garage. That show grew into EWTN — a media network that with the Vatican's blessing, IS catholic TV around the world. Mother Angelica was a pioneer in getting faith filled conversation into the very laps of people all over the world. She did so with common sense, a friendly demeanor, and a faith that was contagious. You didn't have to be a catholic to appreciate what she accomplished. ~Jimmy Spear
