These passionate young adults served and learned about various social services, ministries and organizations that work through the Tulsa area including Iron Gate Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry, Emergency Infant Services, the Day Center of Tulsa, The John Hope Franklin Reconciliation Park, the Greenwood Cul-



tural Center, Oklahomans for Equality, Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma, and First Christian Church of Tulsa. The group served and learned from these organizations as they each respond in different ways, working together to serve the disenfranchised people throughout Tulsa. Harvard Avenue Christian Church served as home for the week and shared much hospitality.

Throughout the group's time they were busy packaging diapers, sorting clothes, building love-in kits for the newly housed, serving and distributing food, being exposed to the horrific story of Tulsa's racial problems of the past (1921 Race Riot - massacre of over 300 black citizens), yet seeing all through the lens of God's Spirit of reconcilation and care.

Bit from Brad

Capital Campaign Update: With the ending of 2016, so too did FCC complete its 2nd year of our 3-year capital campaign. To date, 87% of all pledges have been received, leaving a balance of only 13% to receive for the final 12 months!!! This is cause for great celebration as most mainline Protestant congregations across the USA only reach 75% of their goal with a full 25% remaining for their final 12 months!!! To this mile-stone achieved, I say, "Thank you; Thank you!!!" Your commitment and passion are evident by keeping your promise to your pledge!! So, thank you again!

Next steps: so what more progress is needed for Tier One Capital Campaign Projects? Three more projects remain, all of which are indoors; they are: 1) installing a safer balcony railing; 2) installing various ADA safety railings throughout the buildings; and 3) updating our current smoke alarm system. Together these three project costs should total between \$50,000-\$60,000. Bob Hutton, our Capital Campaign Project Manager, is looking into these matters and we hope to have progress this Spring. Thank you Bob!!!

as needed; assist in evangelistic visitation; be an example in Christian character and faithfulness; and perform such other duties as shall promote the growth and welfare of the Church. In addition, Elders preside at the Lord's Table; provide for the spiritual oversight and development of individual members of the congregation; assist in the conduct of worship, the ordinance of baptism and in the serving of communion to the homebound. Deacons prepare and serve Communion and

assist the Elders in the development and care of individual members of the congregation.

(Pat Rybolt, chairperson)


