

Ash Wednesday

Bit from Brad

This Sunday, Transfiguration Sunday, marks the last Sunday of the season of Epiphany. In many ways, it marks the closing of the Advent/Christmas/Epiphany seasons. Advent prepares us for the coming God's in-flesh/incarnation in Christ Jesus; Christmas celebrates Christ's birth, God's very presence in our midst; and Epiphany celebrates God's light and love made manifest through his followers. In Advent we await the light; at Christmas we celebrate the light's arrival; and during Epiphany we allow Christ's light to shine through us! That culminates with the dazzling brilliance of Christ upon the Mount of Transfiguration where Jesus' full, true nature is revealed to the present disciples.

Equipped now with God's light, since we are "the light of the world" as Jesus proclaims, we are now prepared for the long, hard road of Lent, making our way to the cross. Jesus says, "Take up your cross and follow me." And so now we begin our spiritual pilgrimage, our soul journey. For Lent this year I will preach a series called Cross Encounters, highlighting those whom Jesus encountered along the way to the cross. We will encounter the Serpent, tackling sin and repentance; we'll encounter Nicodemus, discussing how seeing is believing; then we'll meet the Woman at the Well, reflecting on how baptismal waters symbolize Jesus' living water; next we'll encounter The Blind Man healed by Jesus, testifying to Jesus' restoring and forgiving powers, and finally we'll encounter Lazarus, a precursor to eternal, abundant life and the life filled with the Holy Spirit.

Each of these Cross Encounters correlates with the Disciples of Christ founder, Walter Scott and his Five-finger Exercise – 1) Repent, 2) Believe, 3) Baptism, 4) Forgiveness, and 5) the Holy Spirit. Scott taught that we believers are responsible for the first three and God fulfills the last two. So on this last Sunday of Epiphany, Transformation Sunday, absorb all the light from Christ as you can, my friend, so you'll be fortified for the heavy, dark, pensive journey of Lent. But fear not, the resurrection and Holy Spirit await us on the other side of Lent! Until then, remember, Let Your Light Shine!!!

The department works in cooperation with the Treasurer of the Administrative Board to oversee all financial operations of the Church. The Department also educates all members of the congregation in the principles of Christian Stewardship, and implements an annual Stewardship Campaign so that the Church may fulfill its mission. Specifically, the department will:

- oversee the Financial Operations of the Church, in cooperation with the Treasurer of the Administrative Bd.;
- draft a proposed annual Church Budget to be submitted for Cabinet approval and subsequent Administrative Board approval;
- provide Education on Christian stewardship;
- organize and implement an annual stewardship campaign;
- explore additional revenue opportunities beyond the Stewardship Campaign;
- periodically provide Estate-Planning Seminars;
- periodically review bequest policies and recommend needed changes; establish policies in regard to the use of memorial and non-restricted gifts

"Old Law & New Order" -A Biblical Storytelling Concert


Larry Brown will present excerpts from the Gospel of Mark.
