

Bit from Brad

2nd-to-Last Column before Departing for Sabbatical or... 13 Days Remaining!

The word "sabbatical" takes its root from the Hebrew, Shabbat, literally translated as Sabbath, meaning "to rest." When clergy "go on sabbatical" it is an extended rest; but for what purpose? Is it bonbons and peeled grapes by the poolside? No, it is for a deeper purpose, a much deeper

purpose. The 23rd Psalm begins: "The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He restores my soul." And that is the purpose of clergy sabbatical – soul restoration! Sabbaticals are meant for the soul of clergypersons to be restored by God, which requires clergy being removed from the regular week-to-week life of the church. This interruption allows the soul to rest from clergy stress, to be still in the green pastures, and hear God's word afresh, away from the daily pastoral stress.

What stressors do clergy deal with? Check out this compilation of stats on Clergy Stress from Soul Shepherding's website https://www.soulshepherding.org/2018/01/sabbatical-guide-pastors/

"Many research studies have shown that pastoral work is acutely stressful, draining, and dangerous for the pastors and their families. Here are a few of the statistics on pastor stress:

- 90% work 55 to 75 hours per week
- 90% feel fatigued and worn out every week
- . 91% have experienced some form of burn out
- 70% have a lower self-esteem then when they entered the ministry
- 70% fight depression

The average seminary trained pastor lasts five years in professional ministry. Pastors get so preoccupied caring for others that their own souls suffer:

- 72% only study the Bible when preparing their sermons for others
- 70% do not have a close friend
- 50% do not regularly meet with an accountability partner or group
- 44% do not regularly take a day off."

Like most pastors, I experience many but not all of those stressors: long work hours, fatigue, weekly migraines, etc. And while I gladly serve God and church, it's extremely difficult to remain continuously fresh without extended rest. By God's grace and the church's generosity, I've discovered firsthand that sabbaticals are vital for me remaining refreshed and recharged to God's calling in my life; thereby making me a better leader, preacher, and steward of the church. Having two previous sabbaticals before this one, I can gratefully say that I do not suffer depression, I maintain a healthy sense of self-worth, and I am blessed to have served 25 continuous years in professional ministry in the local church setting. And I credit my sabbatical experiences as key to my professional and spiritual wellbeing.

This particular Sabbatical will be unlike any previous Sabbatical as the majority of time will be devoted to constructing, evaluating, and writing my doctoral project and dissertation. My project must take place in my ministerial setting (First Christian Church) so I will come up to FCC from time-to-time to meet with folks regarding my project, though not on Sunday mornings. Additionally, Trish, the kids, and I will take a few weeks off in the middle for a family summer vacation. My goal is to experience soul restoration through writing my dissertation and time spent with family. Something to which I greatly look forward! If you have further questions, please ask!

So, thank you First Christian Church for honoring me with this opportunity for my soul restoration!! I look forward to seeing what "new thing" God calls us when I return. In the meantime, I'll see you in church on Sundays May 27th and June 3rd.
