# Future Serving at Loaves & Fishes

Survey Will Expand Food Outreach Turn yours in by Sun., Dec. 15!

The Church in Society Department seeks the congregation's input as to interest in our serving at Loaves and Fishes in 2020. In order to serve the six nights of meals (every other month on the 4th Monday) there will need to be committed teams of volunteers to cook, transport and serve.

The department will try a team model in 2020 — utilizing all those who always show interest — placed on teams designated with certain months to serve. This will do away with the cumbersome approach of asking for volunteers six times a year.

There will need to be enough volunteers AND team leaders to form several teams for this critical outreach ministry to thrive in 2020. We are good at this ministry and thus are now taking it a step in a new organizational direction.

A <u>four-question survey</u> will be sent out with the weekly Visitor email for electronic reply and available in the office/narthex in paper form. We hope to have them in by <u>Dec. 15</u>.

I always find FCC's Living Nativity a joyful occasion each year! Children reenacting the first Christmas and all the wonderful moments that spontaneously occur – angels flapping their arms better than any professional ballerina, shepherds breaking into the "Orange Justice" or do a "Dab" or whatever is the latest cool dance move, or when a passing family asks if their preschooler can don a costume and join the Nativity! Those are the moments that make each year sheer joy for me.

This year was no exception, as passing cars would lower their windows to listen to the narration and you'd see a grandmother smiling ear to ear, a child's eyes wide with amazement, a parent's nostalgic yearning to return to church.
